Ohio law giving parents the right to see everything their child is exposed to.

Inspect curriculum. Parents have rights in Ohio. The Ohio Revised Code (ORC) permits parents the right to examine and inspect all school material that is used in the instruction of their child. <https://codes.ohio.gov/ohio-revised-code/section-3313.60> The following is the specific language related to parental rights found in ORC 3313.60.(G) Upon the request of any parent or legal guardian of a student, the board of education of any school district shall permit the parent or guardian to promptly examine, with respect to the parent's or guardian's own child:(1) Any survey or questionnaire, prior to its administration to the child;(2) Any textbook, workbook, software, video, or other instructional materials being used by the district in connection with the instruction of the child;(3) Any completed and graded test taken or survey or questionnaire filled out by the child;(4) Copies of the statewide academic standards and each model curriculum developed pursuant to section 3301.079 of the Revised Code, which copies shall be available at all times during school hours in each district school building.

State Board Statement on Curriculum Recommendations

Pursuant to ORC 3301.079(B)(3) and 3313.60, it is the responsibility of Ohio's local boards of education to vet and approve curriculum and educational materials for use in the public schools within their district.

The use of any materials posted or linked to on the Ohio Department of Education website, including materials within Ohio's Learning Standards or Appendices or any state model curricula or other educational resource material, is entirely up to the discretion of each local board of education.

While they can write statements like this, they must also make alternative assessment tools lawful and accessible to all students.
